


2025 Partners in Conservation (PIC)

- Funds Available TBD
- Minimum: \$5,000
- Maximum: \$70,000
- Two years to complete
- Up to 15% admin/indirect costs
- Funds available
 June 1, 2025



2025 PIC Timeline



EMSWCD Grant Program Goals

Complement other EMSWCD program efforts in water quality, soil health, fish and wildlife habitat and sustainable agriculture.

Increase conservation benefits for communities and populations experiencing disparities in environmental health, environmental education, and natural amenities.

Build resilience to climate change in local communities, mitigate climate change impacts, and build momentum for climate change action.

Establish school and community gardens and support sustainable and culturally appropriate agriculture practices.

Prepare residents for careers or education in natural resources, agriculture, nature education, or other nature-related fields by supporting mentorship, youth programs, and job skill development.

What do our grants support?

- Habitat restoration or conservation
- Sustainable agriculture or gardening
- Water quality projects
- Hands-on learning for youth and/or adults
- Expanding equitable access to projects and programs
- Improving environmental health
- Planning or designs



Equity and Impact

- Address disparities in environmental health, environmental education, and natural amenities
- Build resilience to climate change impacts – defined broadly by the community
- Directly benefit Black,
 Indigenous, or other
 communities of color, low-income communities, or other
 historically marginalized groups.



Who can apply?

- Nonprofit 501(c)(3) taxexempt organizations
- Community groups with a fiscal sponsor
- Government agencies
- Schools and educational institutions
- Native American tribes




PIC Review Process

- Grant Review Committee appointed by Board of Directors
- Staff review of applications for eligibility and completeness
- Committee reviews and recommends grants to staff and board for funding
- Board has final approval

2024 PIC - by the numbers

- 48 eligible applications
- \$2,314,329 total amount requested
- \$1,050,000 awarded to 26 applicants
- 12 first-time applicants



Working in ZoomGrants

- Primary applicant "controls" the grant application
 - Invites others to contribute (collaborators)
 - Submits the application
- Character limits include spaces
- ZoomGrants cannot take any formatting cut and paste only plain text
- Auto saves your responses look for pop up "saving"
- Help button on top of each ZoomGrants page

Match Funding

Match Not	Match Required	Match Exception/Waiver
Required		
Applications requesting \$10,000 or less.	 Applications requesting \$10,000 or more. Applicants are expected to secure matching funds equal to or exceeding the amount requested from EMSWCD. This match may include cash, in-kind contributions, funding from other sources, or a combination thereof. The grantee will be required to document match funding and track expenditures. 	 Applications requesting \$10,000 \$30,000, AND the applicant meets one of the following criteria:Organization has been in operation for less than three years, OR Organization has not received a PIC grant before, OR The organization's annual operating budget is less than \$250,000.

Insurance Coverage

• EMSWCD requires that grantees provide proof of insurance coverage for the duration of their grant-funded activities.

 If you or your fiscal sponsor do not have insurance, grant money can be used to purchase coverage and should be included in your application's proposed budget.

Grant Evaluation Questions

- Are the proposed project activities, timeline, budget and experience sufficient to create the impact the project proposes?
- Are community disparities addressed in the project, such as access to nature, environmental education, or environmental health?
- How well does this proposed project advance equity, and inclusion and create benefits for underserved communities through the project impacts, partnerships, and organizational equity practices?

Grant Evaluation Questions

- Is the project led by, or include meaningful engagement with,
 the communities being served or participating in the project?
- How well does this project or program build resilience to climate change impacts, mitigate climate change through carbon sequestration or reducing emissions, and/or educate the public about climate change?
- Can they do it? Has the applicant demonstrated their capacity (together with their partners) to meet proposal goals?
